Will the Real Church Please Stand Up?

No one can lay a foundation other than that which is laid, which is Jesus Christ. Now if anyone builds on the foundation with gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, straw—each one's work will become manifest, for the Day will disclose it, because it will be revealed by fire, and the fire will test what sort of work each one has done (1 Corinthians 3:11-13).

Dear Brothers and Sisters of our Lord Jesus Christ,

On Sunday, January 5th, at 9:30am in the Gym we will begin a new Bible study based on the book, Will the Real Church Please Stand Up? written by Rev. Matthew Richard. In his first book, Pastor Richard took us through the Scriptures to identify the twelve false Christs in today's churches. In this sequel he will lead us through the Scriptures to identify seven false churches that, like Babel, will crumble and fall. By the end of the book, we will see which church is left standing. Pastor Richards writes,

The tower of Babel never reached its pinnacle. Yet the fervor to work toward heaven remains, as mankind continues to gather around self-erected towers in an attempt to get closer to heaven and experience unity. As we scan the horizon of Christendom, we can see present-day towers of Babel. Objects and ideas are lifted to heights of glory where people gather in today's churches and worship. Tragically, even though many churches bear the name of Christ, they unite around lofty Christless towers, striving for what they deem is the church's end goal. In the end, these towers draw them up and away from the name of Christ, making them false churches.

The church left standing, as the apostle Paul reminds us, is not built on wood, hay, or straw, rather it is "built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Christ Jesus himself being the cornerstone, in whom the whole structure, being joined together, grows into a holy temple in the Lord" (Ephesians 2:20-21). The true church is the one in which Jesus does the work of building a new race, a new humanity known as the Church. As Rev. Dr. Kenneth Korby writes,

Mortified with Him in His cross, vivified with Him in His resurrection, this new people is a living, growing organism. Created by the Holy Spirit, she is the carrier and agent of that life-giving spirited word. Even while she lives in the wilderness, pursued by death, she is nurtured and built on the foundation. Living in the midst of cultures and civilizations that are built on the deceit of evading death, she is built in truth with wisdom.

The Apostle warns against building with wood, hay, and stubble, noting that these materials are flammable. They are fuel in the fire of judgment and the day of the Lord. The true church is built with the gold, silver, and precious stones of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, the confession that Jesus is Lord. For Jesus Himself says, "On this rock I will build my church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it" (Matthew 16:18b). Join us as we unpack what all this means starting Sunday, January 5<sup>th</sup>.


