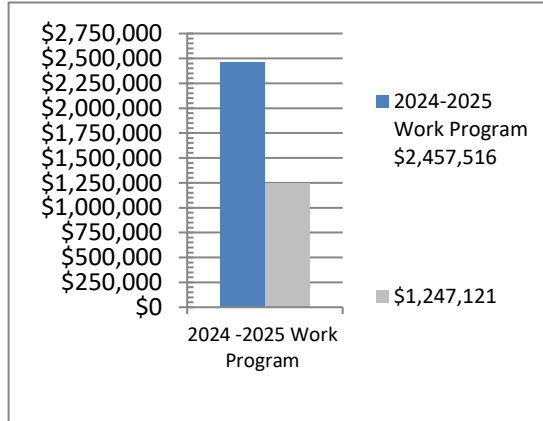

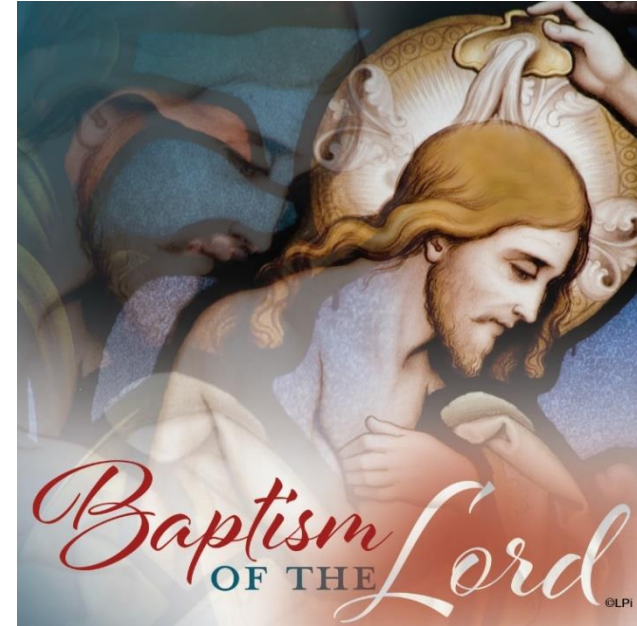

Next Sunday's Readings: Isaiah 62:1-5; 1 Cor. 12:1-11; John 2:1-11



THIS WEEK IN SUNDAY SCHOOL: Students will study "Preaching and Perils" this week. After an extended stay in Greece, Paul sets off on another journey, finally arriving in Troas. There, as he preaches late into the night, a young man named Eutychus falls asleep on a window ledge and tumbles three floors to his death. Paul rushes to his side and restores Eutychus to life. Later, in his second letter to the Church at Corinth, Paul recounts in detail the numerous hardships he endured in his ministry.

Isaiah 43:1-7 ¹But now thus says the LORD, he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel: "Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. ²When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you. ³For I am the LORD your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior. I give Egypt as your ransom, Cush and Seba in exchange for you. ⁴Because you are precious in my eyes, and honored, and I love you, I give men in return for you, peoples in exchange for your life. ⁵Fear not, for I am with you; I will bring your offspring from the east, and from the west I will gather you. ⁶I will say to the north, Give up, and to the south, Do not withhold; bring my sons from afar and my daughters from the end of the earth, ⁷everyone who is called by my name, whom I created for my glory, whom I formed and made."

Romans 6:1-11 ¹What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound? ²By no means! How can we who died to sin still live in it? ³Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? ⁴We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life. ⁵For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. ⁶We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. ⁷For one who has died has been set free from sin. ⁸Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. ⁹We know that Christ being raised from the dead will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. ¹⁰For the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives he lives to God. ¹¹So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

Luke 3:15-22 ¹⁵As the people were in expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Christ, ¹⁶John answered them all, saying, "I baptize you with water, but he who is mightier than I is coming, the strap of whose sandals I am not worthy to untie. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and with fire. ¹⁷His winnowing fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire." ¹⁸So with many other exhortations he preached good news to the people. ¹⁹But Herod the tetrarch, who had been reproved by him for Herodias, his brother's wife, and for all the evil things that Herod had done, ²⁰added this to them all, that he locked up John in prison. ²¹Now when all the people were baptized, and when Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, the heavens were opened, ²²and the Holy Spirit descended on him in bodily form, like a dove; and a voice came from heaven, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."

Notes on Today's Divine Service

Treasures from the Church Fathers: "Now then, all of you who believe in God's Word, let your watchword for entering the New year be this: "I AM BAPTIZED!" Although the world may laugh at this comfort, the enthusiasts vex its confidence.... nevertheless, abandon any other dearly held pledges and speak only throughout the entire year to come, in all terrors of conscience and necessity through sin and death: "I AM BAPTIZED INTO CHRIST! I AM BAPTIZED INTO CHRIST! HALLELUJAH!" And you shall prevail! In every time of need, you will find comfort in your Baptism; on account of it Satan will flee from your faith and confession and in death you will see heaven opened and finally come into the joy of your Lord to celebrate a great year of jubilee, a year of praise, with all the angels forever and ever. Today's Reading: The Baptism of our Lord is an "Epiphany" of the one true God in the flesh and blood of Jesus Christ. In divine mercy, He takes His place with sinners and takes their sin upon Himself. "When all the people were baptized," Jesus submitted Himself to a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins (Luke 3:21). He had no sins of His own, but He took the sins of the world upon Himself and so was baptized into His own death. Therefore, "when you pass through the waters," He is with you (Is. 43:2). He created you for His glory, and He has redeemed you with His blood, that you may be His own and live with Him in His Kingdom (Is. 43:1, 7). As you are baptized with a baptism like His, so also are you united with Him in His death and resurrection that you "might walk in newness of life" (Rom. 6:4). For all who are baptized into Christ Jesus receive His anointing of the Holy Spirit and are named by His Father as beloved and well-pleasing sons and daughters.

Liturgical Catechesis: "In the festivals of the Baptism and the Transfiguration of Our Lord - on the first and final Sundays of the Epiphany season, respectively - the voice to God the Father and the anointing of the Holy Spirit confirm that Jesus is the Christ, the beloved and well pleasing Son of God in the flesh. These impressive manifestations of our Lord's deity, which serve as bookends to the entire season, are marked by their own unique Proper Prefaces. Scripturally and liturgically, both of these occasions serve as turning points toward the cross and resurrection. Certainly, the significance of Jesus' Baptism must be acknowledged. It corresponds not only to the Transfiguration at the conclusion of the Epiphany season but more to the cross and resurrection and to Pentecost and Holy Trinity. It is the fulfillment of John the Baptist's Advent preaching, while it also anticipates, in the Body of Christ, the consummation of all things and the life everlasting of all the baptized." *Lutheran Service Book - Companion to the Service.*

Sermon: Today Jesus is baptized by John the Baptist in the Jordan River. Even though He had no sins to repent of, no sins to be forgiven of, He was baptized. Not because He needed it, but because we needed it. If He had not been baptized then our baptisms would be empty. For in response to the question in the Catechism, "*How can water do such great things?*" the answer is that "*Certainly not just water, but the word of God in and with the water does these things ?*" Today, that is what is pictured for us! The Word of God in the water - literally! The Word made flesh, in the water, for us. And by seeing Him in the water, we remember our Baptism and that He is still in the water for us. And we remember that the sins that are washed off of us were put on Him. When He walked up out of that water, it was with all of our sins upon Him, and therefore also with our death sentence upon Him. And so it is that from that moment on, with our sins, He began His relentless journey to the cross. To pay the price not only for the sin of the world, but for my sin.

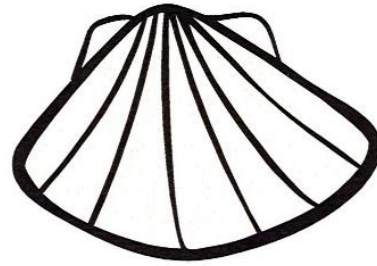

What is "The Baptism of Our Lord"?

Today is the First Sunday after the Epiphany. Today we celebrate the day that our Lord Jesus was baptized by John the Baptizer. That's right, Jesus was baptized just like you!

Why was Jesus baptized?

Jesus' Baptism is very important. When Jesus was baptized, it marked the beginning of His mission to save the world from sin through His death on the cross and His resurrection from the dead. As Scripture says, Jesus' Baptism was one of the many things He did to "fulfill all righteousness." Because of Jesus and all He has done for us, our Baptism is now a source of forgiveness, life and salvation.



Parents: Before or after the service, allow your children to approach the baptismal font in the sanctuary. Remind them that this is where our life in Jesus begins. Because of God's gifts in Baptism, we have been washed clean, and now we are His children.
